Overall Goal

Access to health services and financial risk protection are improved in Thailand and participating countries.

Project Purpose

Implementation of UHC in Thailand and participating countries is improved.

Country: Thailand and Participating Countries (in and out of ASEAN countries)

Implementing Organization: Ministry of Public Health, National Health Security Office Term of Cooperation: July 14, 2016 to July 13, 2020



Background:

- In 2002, Thailand launched the Universal Coverage Scheme (UCS). This significant health reform enabled 99.5 percent of the total population of Thailand to be covered by health schemes. Thailand has been known worldwide for achieving UHC. Through its rich experiences, Thailand has actively been assisting other countries.
- However, Thailand is now facing new challenges such as increasing healthcare costs, different service coverage etc., and the impact of the rapidly aging population on the health systems. Financial sustainability and quality services are therefore of critical importance for the three health schemes.

Output 1. Capacity on improving implementation of UHC is strengthened in Thailand.




